Serving One Another

Last Sunday's scripture, John 11's story of the raising of Lazarus, also brought Jesus and the disciples back to Judea, to the heart of his opposition. Thomas recognizes the danger, others likely do as well, but Jesus is clear that he must go. There is great intentionality in the gospel of John, it's clear Jesus knows what he's doing and embarks on this path in the full light of day, seeing (as so many in John do not) what lies ahead for him. It's a journey to suffering and death, to pouring himself out for others, to serving those he loves on an unimaginable scale.


As we make our way through Lent, we witness throughout these stories in John all the ways Jesus is serving others, healing others, inviting others to see God's love in new ways. As we move toward Holy Week, we often remember in our celebration of Maundy Thursday both Jesus' institution of the Lord's Supper and the footwashing. Tied together, Jesus' humility in washing his disciples feet is but a pale shadow of what he will do as body is broken, blood outpoured. Lest they miss it, he makes it clear they are to follow his example and serve one another. There is no hierarchy in the Kingdom of God, the greatest are called to serve the least.

These moments where Jesus speaks plainly, calling the disciples to observe and follow, are important. We know Jesus path was unique, his work accomplished salvation for all time and we cannot walk that path. But time after time he was clear that this path of service, of love and care for neighbor, was our call too. Sometimes the journey of Lent, the Lenten disciplines, make it seem like it is primarily a journey inward into our

personal relationship with God. While there is indeed an inward, reflective component to Lent as we answer the call to take stock of our lives. But if we are measuring how faithfully we walk the path of discipleship, that is also a journey out, into deeper engagement with neighbor.

Our Lenten midweek services this year are based on a worship planning resource published by the National Civil Rights Museum in Nashville as part of the remembrance of the 50th anniversary of the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. in 1968. To grapple with the legacy of Dr. King and to consider where we've been and where we need to go in the struggle for Civil Rights is to follow Jesus' example, to wash one another's feet. Or, to put it another way, to grapple seriously with the legacy of Jesus means our Lenten journey is also a journey toward greater justice for all of God's beloved people.
