

LOVE IS BORN

One of the most moving moments in our worship life each year is the end of our Christmas service, when the winter sky outside has become dark, and when we dim whatever lights have illuminated the rest of our service thus far. From the Christ candle, we begin to pass around the flame to candles of all those gathered in the sanctuary. As we sing "Silent Night," the glow of our candles becomes brighter.

What we do together in this holy moment is not merely partake in a beautiful tradition (although it is certainly that too). Through our candles, our singing, our gathering together as neighbors and strangers, we are also witnessing to the reality that Love is born into an often-loveless world.

As we prepare for Love's arrival in our lives and in the world again this Christmas, we will be singing about it, praying about it, and hearing scriptures and sermons about it throughout the Advent season. Drawing from the lines of Holden [Morning] Prayer, we will explore "love that fills the night with wonder (the first Sunday of Advent), love that warms the weary soul (the second Sunday), love that bursts all chains asunder (the third Sunday), and a love that sets us free and makes us whole (the fourth)." Please join us each week at 9:30 am for these services.

As we light candles each week this Advent season, and the increasing light of the flames (juxtaposed by the beauty and wonder of the increasing darkness of our winter season) remind us of the moment when, in a few weeks from now, we will fill the sanctuary with our candle light, may we prepare our hearts and minds for the Love that will--indeed is already--come. -Pastor Ali
