

Discussion on Benevolence funds and setting up a task force to discuss. Progeny lease will be updated as of July 1st with additional storage space being added.


There are new gardening projects and the grounds are looking beautiful. Thank you to all who are involved in this process, we all greatly appreciate it.

VISION + VOCATION

In the fall of 2022, the Vision + Vocation Team began to gather gathering to listen for God's call. As we shared at our Pentecost Potluck Picnic a few weeks ago, we entered into this process for a few reasons: First,



because had been over twenty years since the we had has revisited our mission and vision, and much has changed within that time both in the congregation and wider community. Second, because we realize that we can't financially sustain what we're currently doing forever. And third (and most importantly!), because the Spirit is alive and among us--and as we proclaim as both Easter people and Reformation people--is always at work "doing a new thing" (Isaiah 43:19).

So, after a year and a half of prayerful listening, the Vision + Vocation Team has begun to tentatively discern being "Called to Life Together." But in order to unpack what this call might mean we've needed the voices of the wider Cross of Glory community.

During Lenten and Easter seasons, you were invited to take part in Discernment Dialogues --an opportunity not only to learn more about this discernment process thus far, but to take part in it going forward, sharing what you imagine God's call to life together looks like here at Cross of Glory. Thank you to all who took part in these conversations!

On June 4, the whole congregation was invited to come to the Pentecost Potluck Picnic, at which we all shared our different call stories and imaginations for what God might be up to.

This summer, the Vision + Vocation team will be taking what you shared and drawing on it as we begin to further express God's call. Instead of writing a mission statement or a strategic plan, we will be crafting what we're calling a "Community Liturgy." The word liturgy means "the work of the people," so this liturgy seeks to articulate what the "work of the people" who are living out God's call to life together looks like on the ground. In future discernment and decision-making (whether it be about programming, staffing, building, budget, etc.), our Community Liturgy can help guide us and hold us accountable as we work to faithfully live out God's call to life together.

We invite you to hold the Vision + Vocation team in prayer as we continue on in this work, and we look forward to continuing to share more in the coming months!
