

- 3. Return to your seat, and spend time offering a silent prayer to God about the prayer from the tree.
- 4. You may take the star home with you to continue praying this week. Tip: Keep it in a place where you'll see it often--fridge, car, backpack, pocket, purse, etc.--and be reminded to keep lifting up your neighbor's request in prayer!
