On the fourth Sunday of this month (April 28), join us for Table Talks, our monthly education hour where we explore the ways



BREAKING BREAD WITH OUR MUSLIM NEIGHBORS

For nearly 20 years, the Minnesota Council of Churches has invited Christians and others to get to know their Muslim neighbors through a partnership with the Muslim American Society. During Ramadan, the month on the Islamic lunar

calendar during which Muslims abstain from food and drink from sunup to sundown, mosques are opening their doors to share the "iftar" (the breaking

of the fast) with neighbors across faith traditions. This year, Ramadan takes place March 10-April 9. LUTHERAN CAMPUS MINISTRY SUNDAY: APRIL 7, 2024

Lutheran Campus Ministry-Twin Cities bears witness to the love and mercy of Christ in the midst of 55,000 young adults at the University of Minnesota - Twin Cities. We often talk about young adults as the "future" of the church, and fail to understand the ways they are shaping it now, in the present. As we move into a new,



post-pandemic life together, we continue to learn so much from the young adults in our midst. Whether bearing the weight of mental illness, entrenched polarization, or the deepening climate crisis, young adults are learning what it means to be resilient and faithful amidst a world that will likely be uncertain for a very long time.

And still, or maybe because of this uncertainty, students are actively engaged with their faith. They are hungry, and they show up to pray, to serve their neighbors, to learn, and to worship together. More than anything, they show up to connect, and to center down in the love of God. At LCM, we see first-hand the incredible work of the Holy Spirit, who animates these young adults and our ministry among them.

We are excited to share that a student will be preaching at Cross of Glory--and other congregations throughout the Twin Cities--on April 7th. Student preachers have been working hard under the guidance of Lutheran pastor, theologian, and renowned author Rev. Barbara Lundblad to prepare to proclaim the Gospel and share stories about their life as a young adult. There will also be a member of the LCM board at Cross of Glory on April 7th to lead a brief educational forum following worship, who will share more about LCM and how congregations can support this vital ministry. 
