

HOLY BAPTISM

Leader: We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. BAPTISM OF SIMON TRANVIK

The baptismal family is invited to gather around the baptismal font. The congregation is invited to rise and face the font.

Leader: Today we celebrate the baptism of Simon Tranvik. God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

Leader: Called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have Simon baptized into Christ? If so, please respond by saying "we do."

Parents: We do.

L: As you bring Simon to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities:

To live with Simon among God's faithful people, bring him to the word of God and the holy supper, teach him the Lord's prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in his hands the holy scriptures, and nurture his faith and prayer, so that he may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.

Leader: Do you promise to help Simon grow in the Christian faith and life? If so, please respond by saying "we do."

Parents: We do.

L: Sponsors, do you promise to nurture Simon in the Christian faith, as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help him live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church? If so, please respond by saying "we do."

Sponsors: We do.

Leader: People of Cross of Glory, do you promise to support Simon and pray for him in his new life in Christ? If so, please respond by saying "we do."

All: We do.

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

Throughout the season of Epiphany, we invite you to take part in the Prayers of the People:

1. Take a paper star (in your bulletin) and write a prayer on it--a prayer for yourself, the church, the neighborhood, the world, creation, or those in need. You may sign your name or leave it anonymous.

2.As the Spirit moves you, come hang your star on the Epiphany tree, and before you return to your seat, take the prayer of someone else from the tree.

3. Spend the remaining prayer time offering a silent prayer to God about the prayer of your neighbor. You may also take the star home with you this week to continue praying. (Tip: keep it in a place--fridge, car, backpack, pocket, purse, etc.--where you'll see it often and be reminded to keep lifting up your neighbor's prayer) *NOTE: If you need assistance hanging your star or retrieving someone else's, cue an usher and we'll be glad to assist you.
