INTRODUCTION

The ancient name for this day is Gaudete, or "Rejoice Sunday". We rejoice in the anticipation and arrival of Jesus. We are calling this service "We Magnify Our Lord".

PRELUDE

WELCOME:

P: Welcome! We are here today rejoicing in the combined stories of the prophesies of a Messiah and the celebration of the glorious night of Jesus' birth. This is a time so filled with joy that angels could not stay in heaven but overflowed from heaven to earth. We anticipate the coming of the Lord.
