# Stories of Call: A Season of Holy Listening

## Lenten Prayer Stations



### Lectio Divina Prayer

Lectio Divina is Latin for "sacred reading." It's an ancient prayer practice that's been used across Christian traditions for centuries. It invites us to listen for God's voice through repetitively reading and praying through scripture.



### Visio Divina Prayer

Visio Divina is Latin for "sacred seeing." Also an ancient form of prayer, this practice invites us to meditate on God's word through artistic depictions of it. At this station, you'll find different pieces of art that span place and time, and a series of reflection questions that prompt us to wonder how God might be speaking through the artistic expressions of the biblical story.



### Breathing Prayer

If we are to "pray without ceasing," as Paul writes, breathing prayers can be a helpful place to start. This station invites us to pray through a portion of the scriptural story of the day according to the rhythm of our breath.



### Prayers on Paper

Prayers may be not only spoken, but also visually expressed. At this station, you're invited to prayerfully write and/or draw in response to the biblical call story.



### Prayers for the Neighborhood

In Jeremiah, we're invited to "pray to God on behalf of the city we find ourselves, for in its welfare we find our own." As such, at this station, you'll find a map of Brooklyn Center, the city where we find ourselves here at Cross of Glory. You'll be invited to prayerfully reflect on our neighborhood--and the people, institutions, and creation within it--write a prayer on a post-it note, and stick it on the city map.

he was going along and approaching Damascus, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, 'Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?' He asked, 'Who are you, Lord?' The reply came, 'I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. But get up and enter the city, and you will be told what you are to do.' The men who were travelling with him stood speechless because they heard the voice but saw no one. Saul got up from the ground, and though his eyes were open, he could see nothing; so they led him by the hand and brought him into Damascus. For three days he was without sight, and neither ate nor drank.

Now there was a disciple in Damascus named Ananias. The Lord said to him in a vision, 'Ananias.' He answered, 'Here I am, Lord.' The Lord said to him, 'Get up and go to the street called Straight, and at the house of Judas look for a man of Tarsus named Saul. At this moment he is praying, and he has seen in a vision a man named Ananias come in and lay his hands on him so that he might regain his sight.' But Ananias answered, 'Lord, I have heard from many about this man, how much evil he has done to your saints in Jerusalem; and here he has authority from the chief priests to bind all who invoke your name.' But the Lord said to him, 'Go, for he is an instrument whom I have chosen to bring my name before Gentiles and kings and before the people of Israel; I myself will show him how much he must suffer for the sake of my name.' So Ananias went and entered the house. He laid his hands on Saul and said, 'Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on your way here, has sent me so that you may regain your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit.' And immediately something like scales fell from his eyes, and his sight was restored. Then he got up and was baptized, and after taking some food, he regained his strength.
