It's always a bit surprising how much the first real snowfall transforms the landscape. The pines, spruce and fir are dusted with snow. The fence lines stand out amidst a background of white. The fields that had been so dark and rich now look almost like frozen lakes, pale brown reeds sticking up through the surface of the icy

snow. Ditches and creek beds are full of brown cattails swaying in the stiff wind. It's lovely, really, at least for those of us who grew up here on the frozen tundra. While it looks cold and dead, we who know how these same fields and forests will burst with green in a few months realize things are just resting, dormant for a time before new life begins.

Ages ago the Psalmists often found the creation to be both sign and metaphor of God's creative work. The beauty of creation reminded them of God's power and protection. The uncertainty and terror of storm and wind and lashing rain reminded them of the mystery of God, that which is unknowable, incomprehensible to the human mind. The seasons served as metaphor for the seasons of life, of family and community and purpose.

What seasons will 2016 bring to Cross of Glory? We are a much smaller place than in the 60's and 70's and it would be tempting to see only decline. Yet new life abounds in the midst of these changes. We just experienced a lively Advent and Christmas with great music, great gatherings and meaningful worship. Under the leadership of Lois Tollefsrud and Judy Lewis, our visitation ministries are getting renewed with many new people getting involved. Members are stepping forward when asked to consider leadership in the new 2016 Church Council.

While none of us know the seasons ahead, we do know that the God of all creation is at work in our midst. Even more amazing, the Good News of Christmas is that this very God is also Emmanuel, God with us, born in a manger to transform death to life, darkness to light. Jesus' love is sure and all our tomorrows rest in God's hands. I wish you every blessing in the New Year, especially the blessing of an ever greater hope and trust in the God who loves you.
