A Green Summer

As Minnesotans, most of us cherish these verdant days. The leaves are out, grass is that intense shade of green and the fields are covered with young crops just up. But these days, being "green" is not necessarily a reference to color. Both in the church and in the wider society there is a growing awareness of environmental degradation and a growing interest in creation care. Created in the image of God, we understand ourselves to be called to care for all creation, to be stewards of all God has created, including ourselves and our neighbors.

While someday I would hope we have a Creation Care Team at Cross of Glory, in the meantime there are many things already underway by Council, leaders and staff. Here are just a few of the Creation Care initiatives you should watch for in the coming months and some ways you can be involved:

- New Lighting: One of the first recommendations in our building review by EnerChange is to look into retrofitting sanctuary, outdoor and other high use lights with low-energy LED's. In some cases there are even zero or low interest grants available for capital outlay that are repaid with energy savings.
- 2) Less Paper: Now that we are accustomed to projected liturgies and hymn words, look for smaller bulletins (the large print version won't change). We will also be creating opportunities to receive only electronic versions of letters and other publications for those who prefer it.
- 3) New Recycling Containers: WE NEED YOU to help us get new recycling containers! Hennepin County has a grant program but we need to apply soon. If you would be willing to help, please let Pastor Doug know

- ASAP. We now have single stream recycling and there are lots of ways we can reduce our trash.
- 4) A Community Garden?: Cross of Glory has been chosen for a Hennepin County grant program called Health@Communities of Faith. We are eligible for up to \$8,000 to address issues related to exercise and healthy food in diverse communities. We will be gathering a team in June to hone our proposal (development of a community garden) and lead this initiative. Please let Pastor Doug know if you would like to be part of the team!

There are major Creation Care initiatives happening throughout the ELCA. Last month during our Minneapolis Synod Assembly a new loan program for congregations was introduced that will assist with initial expenditures. Perhaps this summer would be a nice time to study the ELCA Social Statement, "Caring for Creation: Vision, Hope and Justice" as a way to dig deeper into this important aspect of our faith. Watch for opportunities ahead!


Clean up after the sale will begin around 12:30pm on Saturday, the 11th. We will need many volunteers to get the church cleaned and back to normal.
