God of Light and Darkness

When I was a freshly minted pastor almost 20 years ago, I recruited several of my clergy friends to do a week of continuing education together at Kirkridge Retreat Center in Pennsylvania. The topic was preaching, and five of the best preachers in the country spent the week with our group of 75 or so. The two women among the presenters were especially remarkable, Barbara Brown Taylor and Barbara Lundblad, women I have sought out either in person or in their books ever since and who have shaped me significantly as a preacher and theologian.

I just finished reading Barbara Brown Taylor's "Learning to Walk in the Dark." Barbara is a bit of a mystic, less linear sequential than me and she often dwells in places mainstream modern Christianity sometimes fears to go. She is a woman of extraordinary faith who has not always found the modern church or the way we talk most about God to make sense to her experience of God and the world. This book was an invitation to remember that God created light AND darkness, that God is present and active in both, that fearing God's absence in real or metaphorical darkness is not faithful to the biblical witness.

One of the things I found powerful was her challenge to much of the modern church's tendency towards what she calls "full solar spirituality", the unwavering focus on "absorbing and reflecting the sunny side of faith." This way of thinking about God tends to understand faith as "a sure sense of God's presence, certainty of belief, divine guidance in all things, and reliable answers to prayer." Sounds great, right? We talk about these things, don't we?

The problem is, what happens in the rest of our daily lives, when the darkness comes? What about when we don't have a clear sense of God's presence or activity in our lives? What about when we're not sure what to do? What about when it seems God isn't listening? What about when we are overwhelmed in grief and loss or deep in struggle with the demons that haunt us? What about some of our theological convictions become a little less sure, what if we notice new problems in old metaphors?

The problem with holding on only to the metaphor of light for God's presence and activity is that then we learn to fear the dark. We are left without tools, imagination or language for the other half of our lives, when the metaphorical darkness prevails, when things aren't clear, when words don't seem adequate, when brokenness seems insurmountable. If faith is always a happy, clear, upbeat place, than we are prone to imagine that faith has failed us in these times, maybe even that God has failed us.

Every day is marked by both light and darkness. God created both, darkness is not evil. Christian mystics would remind us that darkness can be an especially powerful moment in which to experience God. Doubt and confusion are not the opposite of faith but part of it. Sadness and pain do not point to the absence of God. God is not contained in our descriptions of God, our creeds and confessions, our rites and ceremonies. At best these give language to our experience of the Holy One. At worst, when they fail us, when they no longer ring true, we're tempted to turn away from God altogether.

For my part I hope to explore the darkness a bit more, to speak more of the mystery of God, the God beyond my knowing. If, perhaps, you too have been taught to fear the dark, I invite you along.

Now that winter is finally over it is time to get geared up for our annual Garage Sale.

The dates for this year's sale are **July 6, 7, 8 and 9th**. We will be setting up for the sale on Saturday **June 4th**. Receiving will begin on Monday **June 6th** until Friday **June 24th**.

Volunteers are needed during the preparation time prior to the sale. The Garage Sale is a great activity that involves many of our church members and their families and friends. It is a social time for everyone with coffee breaks and treats for all. You do not need to work every day during the prep time. We realize that many of our members are still working full-time jobs. If you can work one day a week for a few hours or one evening it will be greatly appreciated. It takes 25-30 people working about 30 hours a week during the preparation time to get ready for the sale. All volunteers work according to their own schedules. They will also get to do some sightseeing.

The Dominican Republic is a Spanish-speaking third world country in the Caribbean. Our youth will experience poverty like they have never seen it before. What is exciting is that five of our seven youth speak Spanish and will be able to build relationships with the Dominican youth. The trip will have a big impact on our youth and will give them a chance to give to people who are less fortunate.

The missions pastor at Lord of Life Lutheran is helping us to coordinate the trip and our group will be working with two mission groups in the DR, Servidores Mundiales and Building Without Borders.
