Micah 6: 6-8

Doing Justice, Loving Kindness

Throughout Lent we are gathering around the questions of our baptismal covenant. This scripture from Micah was the preaching text for my theme, to strive for justice and peace in all the earth. Throughout scripture the people of God are called to live in particular ways, to care for the poor, the widow, the orphan and the stranger as the Old Testament often puts it. Jesus' claims this prophetic legacy in some of his very first words, His proclamation of the day of the Lord's favor in that synagogue in Nazareth.

As a congregation of the ELCA, we live out this call to justice in all three expressions of our church. As a denomination, we have twelve social statements that guide our moral deliberation and action on some of the major social issues of our time. We raise very significant money to fight hunger and poverty both in the United States and globally. Through the Office of the Presiding Bishop and through our public policy offices in Washington and around the country, we organize and lobby for the common good with our social statements guiding our positions.

Closer to home, we work with the 150 congregations of the Minneapolis Area Synod on issues of justice and peace as well. Our mission statement as a synod reads: The Minneapolis Area Synod together so that all experience gracious invitation into life-giving Christian community and live in just and healthy neighborhoods.

I currently serve as a member of the Minneapolis Area Synod Council and as part of the leadership team for our Public Voice Committee. As a Synod we are looking for those opportunities where our voice and action can make a difference in the lives of our communities.

At Cross of Glory, we have a long history of working for the common good through local and global hunger programs, CEAP, the No Barriers foodshelf we host in our building and a variety of other special projects. At the Capitol we work with two significant longtime partners, Lutheran Advocacy and the Joint Religious Legislative Coalition. More recently our most significant partner in justice work has been ISAIAH, an ecumenical coalition of more than 100 congregations. We have a growing team at Cross of Glory and some great opportunities to get involved.

First, the ISAIAH congregations of the Northwest suburbs are meeting ever third Thursday at Cross of Glory at 6:30 pm for training and organizing. The major issues we have chosen to work on right now include an effort to regulate the incredibly oppressive payday lending system and to pass paid sick and family leave legislation. In partnership with many of the historic black congregations of North Minneapolis, we are organizing a major Holy Week action on March 21 around payday lending. We hope to have a large delegation from Cross of Glory!

Together we can live out this aspect of our baptismal covenant and make a real difference in the lives of our neighbors near and far!

Camp Noah comes to Cross of Glory

In partnership with Lutheran Social Services of Minnesota, we are bringing Camp Noah to Cross of Glory the week after Easter (March 28 to April 1), spring break for the Robbinsdale and Minneapolis school districts. This camp will focus on recovery and resiliency for elementary age children in the Liberian community in the aftermath of the Liberian civil war and the ebola crisis.

Here are the daily themes for the week:

Day 1: Life before the Ark: I am Somebody Special

Day 2: Getting Onto the Ark, the Storm Begins: "Storm" Stories

Day 3: Life After the Storm: Why am I feeling this way?

Day 4: On Dry Ground: I can do that

Day 5: Life After the Ark: Can I help you?

Every child receives 30 hours of therapeutic play-focused creative activities with a ratio of 3-4 children for every Certified Camp Staff member. An experienced camp director from another area congregation will coordinate the staff team.
