Letting Go and Taking On: A Season of Change

The Lenten call to repentance is a call to change, to turn, to answer God's call in our lives and be open to God's plan and purpose for our lives and our community. The hymnwriter Joachim Neander proclaimed God's steadfast love in the midst of life's inevitable changes: "All my hope on God is founded who will all my trust renew, who through change and chance will guide me, only good and only true. God unknown, God alone, call my heart to be thine own" (ELW 757). "Making Change" is our theme for our midweek Lenten series this year.

Utilizing a series of themes and texts in a resource from Augsburg Fortress Press, we'll gather around two key scriptures each week. Week 1, "Change of Season," we'll consider our call as the body of Christ to be agents of change in the kingdom or reign of God, much as the yeast in Jesus' little parable. Week 2, "Change of Habit," we'll consider with the Galatians what habits of the Spirit build abundant life. In week 3, "Change of Circumstance," we'll join the disciples in listening to Jesus' challenging proclamation to not worry, not be afraid, even in the midst of real uncertainty. In week 4, "Change of Heart," we'll enter Mark 7, where Jesus confronts the Pharisees with the challenge of truly loving God with the heart not just the lips. Finally, in week 5, we'll hear Jesus reminding the disciples of his path to Jerusalem, to suffering and death. Though they have been yearning for the

Messiah to come, they still have little understanding of God's true plan in the coming of Jesus, for them and for the world.

Lent provides this rare opportunity to pause in the middle of our week and invest in our faith and in our relationships. While I believe this time of worship and fellowship will be meaningful for all who come, I think it is a particular blessing to welcome those who are not often with us for worship Sunday morning, including many of our youth. I know you will join me in sharing with all who are relatively new to this community the joy of being part of this church family and the blessings of worship together.

We meet at 6 pm for a potluck meal and worship will start at 6:45. Once again, if evening worship simply does not work for you, consider attending the noon service at Holy Nativity Lutheran Church at 3900 Winnetka, one of our partner churches. Please ask me if you have any questions or would like more information. If you would like to come in the evening but don't have transportation, please let Sue or me know and we'll see what we can do!
