STEWARDSHIP 2022: BE OF GOOD COURAGE

For over 60 years, pilgrims of many kinds have ventured to the Cascade Mountains of Washington state to visit Holden Village, a Lutheran retreat center that "welcomes all people to form and renew their relationships with God, the earth, and each other." Once a copper mining town, Holden Village is now a place of vibrant educational programming, spiritual retreat, and worship.



Those who visit Holden Village often take their new discoveries back home. For example, Cross of Glory continues to sing the "Holden Evening Prayer" liturgy each year thanks to those in our congregation who have spent time at Holden Village in years past.

But another gift that has traveled far beyond the Cascade Mountains is the "Prayer of Good Courage." The prayer, which is prayed at the end of Holden worship services and has since been incorporated into the *Evangelical Lutheran Book of Worship*, is now prayed at baptisms, weddings, funerals, graduation blessings, ordinations, church openings, church closings, and weekly Sunday services in churches throughout the world.

The words of this prayer--printed on the cover of this newsletter--are the basis for our stewardship theme this year: "Be of Good Courage." Throughout the first weeks of November, we'll be exploring in worship what it means to live out the words of this prayer this next year, both as individuals and as a community of faith. We'll be asking questions like, "what is courage? Where does it come from? What or who is it for? What does it mean to live--and give--courageously?" To explore these guestions, we'll look at different stories in scripture about God's people being called--even in the most dire or uncertain of circumstances--to take heart, take risks, be of good courage. We'll also be praying this prayer in both spoken and sung form in our worship services.

In the coming days, you'll receive a letter in the mail with some stewardship materials, including your 2023 pledge card, which helps us faithfully plan our budget, as well as some information about various ways to give toward the work that God is doing in our congregation and community. I invite you to begin prayerfully considering your financial commitment for the upcoming year-perhaps using the Prayer of Good Courage as your guide!

This stewardship season, as we open ourselves to what God is calling us to in 2023--and to what that means for the giving of our time, talents, and treasures--may we remember that even as we may be led into "ventures of which we cannot see the ending," or by "paths as yet untrodden," or through "perils unknown," as the prayer says, "God's hand is leading us, and God's love is supporting us." And to that we can courageously say: thanks be to God! -Pastor Ali



Updated (bivalent) COVID-19 vaccine boosters are available from Pfizer OV3865 · SW839 LON and Moderna. They are called "bivalent" because they protect against both the original virus that causes COVID-19 and newer Omicron variants. The CDC recommends that people ages 5 years and older receive one updated (bivalent) booster if it has been at least 2 months since their last COVID-19 vaccine dose, whether that was: Their final primary series dose, or an original (monovalent) booster. People who have gotten more than one original (monovalent) booster are also recommended to get an updated (bivalent) booster. Getting a COVID-19 vaccine after you recover from COVID-19 infection provides added protection against COVID-19. Boosters are available through your doctor's office, and at Hy-Vee, Walgreens, CVS, and other pharmacies. Visit the "vaccines" section of the cdc.gov website for more information.

Due to the cold weather and the upcoming flu season, we will continue to have hand sanitizer available for use. Masking and physical distancing at church is not required and is at your own discretion. However, at your preference, feel free to mask, give a peace sign, refrain from hugging or handshaking at the sharing of the peace or other times at the church, as you judge best.
