THE WORK OF THE PEOPLE

Although it's the beginning of Advent (in late November) that marks the beginning of the new church year, it's September--alongside the start of the new school year--when we welcome back many new rhythms in our life together. And so it's September when I am struck again by our community's "liturgy." I don't mean the liturgy of Sunday mornings, although I cherish that too. Rather, I mean the "liturgy" (a word that literally means "the work of the people") that spills out into our whole life together, throughout the entire week.

PASTORAL CARE

Pastor Ali is available for pastoral care. conversation, and prayer. You can reach her by phone and email throughout the week. Her designated hours for pastoral care and conversation (virtual or in-person) are Tuesdays from 10:30-1:30 and Wednesdays from 2-5, and home/ care facility visitation hours are Thursdays from 3-5. Please reach out to schedule a time to connect!

HOME COMMUNION

If you are unable to commune in-person at Cross of Glory, we would love to come visit you and bring you communion. Please reach out if you'd like to schedule a time.

Our liturgy includes tutoring students in the community on Wednesday evenings, fueled by pizza (which all are welcome to come and eat at 5:30!). It includes quilting blankets for community members, and knitting prayer shawls for congregation members. It includes the work of our Faith & Neighboring Practices group, which is headed into our second of two years, learning about ways that our faith shapes and sustains the "liturgy" of neighboring. It includes our Vision & Vocation team, which is hard at work discerning God's call for this next chapter of our life together, a process which we look forward to sharing more with you about in the coming months. It includes the work of WELCA, which fosters fellowship among women in the community through Bible Study and community service. It includes musical ensembles that gather to rehearse during the week so that our Sunday mornings together are even more beautiful and meaningful. It includes serving luncheons to families grieving the loss of a loved one at a funeral. It includes working with our neighbors at CAPI, as we work to make Brooklyn Center a great place for all to live, work, and worship. And of course, it includes less visible work like the care given to our building and grounds, or the care given from one member to another via a phone call. For the things that you do that are named here, and the many more unnamed, THANK YOU.

As these new rhythms begin again this month, we invite you to take part in our shared liturgy, perhaps in a new way this year. As part of God's Work Our Hands Sunday, Rachel will have a "Our Hands" form that we invite you to fill out. On it are a variety of different ways that you are invited to use your hands (and heads and hearts!) for the sake of God's work here at church and in our broader neighborhood. Please stop by and discern where God might be calling you in the liturgy--the holy labor--of our life together. For ALL the ways your hands do God's work in this place, we give thanks!

Council Notes


