SERMON "ENOUGH"

John 10:1-15

Grace to you and peace in the name of the risen Christ. Amen.

Today is the fourth Sunday after Easter in our church year. However, it is probably more accurate to call it "Sheep Sunday!" Did you notice our readings for today? They are literally infested with sheep! The 23rd Psalm says that "the Lord is my shepherd." Now if the Lord is our shepherd what does that make you and me? Sheep! In our Gospel from John chapter 10, Jesus says that he is the good shepherd who has even laid down his life for the sheep. Again, you and I are referred to as sheep. Now I don't know about you, but I'm not sure that I like that!

- In my experience with sheep, it seems to me that they are the geekiest animals on the face of the earth. They can't run. Right? They waddle. Sheep may start out cute, cuddly, and calming but they rarely stay that way through adulthood. Why in the Lord's eyes can't you and I be compared to a horse? When a horse runs it takes big, long elegant strides. Horses gallop so gracefully. But sheep.... they waddle and believe me it is not pretty! In my opinion there is no one more chicken than a sheep...except a chicken! Worst of all, they are prone to wander off and get themselves into all kinds of trouble.
- The word trouble certainly describes the flock of sheep that my Dad had on the farm. They were constantly getting out of the pasture fences and wandering off. I could never understand why he had them. They provided no financial profit and it cost more to have them than they were worth. Yet, my Dad liked those sheep. In spite of all the shenanigans they got into, he simply delighted in them and faithfully cared for them.
- I remember one spring day, our sheep decided to go on a "spring fling." They got out of the pasture and wandered off. My Dad had me go with him in the pickup and drive around to the neighbors asking them if they had seen our sheep. (Do you know how embarrassing that is?!) After several days, the sheep were still not to be found. The look on my Dad's face was a mixture of concern and sadness. I suggested to him that we just donate them to whoever would take them. This suggestion did not go over very well. Instead, my Dad hired a pilot to take him up in his small airplane to search for these pesky creatures. And wouldn't you know it luck was not with me! From the air my Dad was able to spot his beloved animals mixed in with another farmer's sheep miles from our home.

The reunion of my Dad and his sheep was amazing. He called out to them. They pricked up their ears. His was a voice that they knew so well and so they came. It looked to me like they were smiling. They didn't even have the decency to hang their heads in shame. They were smiling and my Dad

was smiling too. Would the sheep cause trouble again? Yes! Many times! Even so, no matter how many times they went their own way, it never changed how much my Dad valued them.

My Dad's commitment to his wayward sheep sounds a lot like God, doesn't it? Each of us hopefully knows how human we are - how "sheep-like" we can be. The truth is, God knows this about us too. Yet amazingly God values us; God delights in us. In God's eyes we are enough - we are God's beloved. This, I believe, is the message of our Gospel for today. Not only is it a good message but it is a needed message!

Every day, you and I are hearing messages that tell us that we are insufficient or not good enough. These messages come in a variety of ways. Sometimes they come from other people's hurtful words or critical comments. All too often, we are the ones who heap diminishing words on ourselves. In our self-talk, how often do we say things like: "I'm not very capable" or "I'm not worthy of that" or "I don't measure up." Added to these messages, each of us is daily bombarded with a barrage of ads that seek to convince us that we are not enough. These ads work precisely by creating in us a sense of lack and a profound sense of insufficiency. The message of the ads is that the only way to satisfy this lack is to be more or do more or get more. The truth is, these "not enough" messages are a lie. They are like that thief that only wants to rob us of who we truly are in God. These "not enough" messages take from us the abundant life of meaning and purpose that God want for us now.

Jesus says in our Gospel, "I have come that they may have life and have it abundantly." Jesus does not only make this promise. He puts his money where his mouth is. More accurately, he puts his life where his promise is: "I am the good shepherd" Jesus says, "The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." Why? Why does Jesus lay down his life? The answer is: To tell us that we are in fact ENOUGH! Jesus, especially in John's gospel, doesn't die in order to make some kind of payment to God or to satisfy God's wrath because of our sin. For the gospel writer John, Jesus is the revealer - the one who comes to make the invisible God visible and the unapproachable God accessible. Jesus comes to tell us that we are already God's beloved! We need no more stuff, or status, or achievements, or talents, or savings accumulation to be worthy of God's love. Jesus, the gate keeper to the kingdom of God, proclaims that in God's love and mercy we already have abundant life now - we are enough.

Because we are surrounded by so many wrong messages, we often need to be reminded of what God says about us. In fact, let's practice affirming this promise right now. Would you repeat out loud: "I am God's beloved child. I am enough." Now if you are worshiping with others today, will you turn to someone near you and say out loud: "You are God's beloved. You are enough." Please know that claiming this promise is not something that you need to be shy about. This promise is all about God! My friend, who you truly are is God's gift to you!

There is great power in proclaiming to ourselves and to others that we are enough - we are God's beloved. Consider the writer Mary Ann Bird. She relates how she was born with a cleft palate. Because she had a misshapen lip, crooked nose, lopsided teeth and garbled speech, she was often made fun of by the other children. Mary Ann was convinced that no one outside of her family loved her. But then there was a teacher in the second grade, Mrs. Leonard. It was time for the annual hearing test. Mrs. Leonard gave the test to everybody in the class. She would stand a short distance behind the student, have the student cover one ear, and the teacher would whisper and have the student repeat it back. Often the teacher would say something like, "The sky is blue." or "Do you have new shoes?" With her back to Mrs. Leonard, Mary Ann waited for the words. Finally, Mrs. Leonard said in a whisper, "I wish you were my little girl." Mary Ann couldn't believe it! She said that these seven words literally changed her life!"

People of God, we have a God who doesn't just whisper, "You are enough." God shouts for all creation to hear that YOU are God's beloved and nothing will ever change God's mind about that.

Honestly, I would still rather be compared to a horse.... or a German shepherd dog...or even a lion. Yet, we are so "sheep-like!" May we always rejoice that we are God's sheep! You and I are God's sheep! Our amazing and loving God just delights in saying that we are God's beloved and in God we are - and always will be - ENOUGH! Thanks be to God. Amen.
